As I am away for this months meeting I wanted to update on the following:-

LACOCK SCHOOL

The school has submitted a grant request to be discussed at LPC February meeting. The £476.01 requested will provide additional vital learning resources to those already provided for the school by the P.T.A.

Lacock school P.T.A. are proactive and successful and support school with funding in many areas for example.

- £3000 towards essential I T equipment,
- £1000 towards curriculum resources,
- £400 annually towards maths resources,
- £1200 annually towards library resources

They also provide school events at no cost to the school I.e. annual fireworks and school duck races, Events that build on parent/child/school relationships.

The grant to be considered is the first money requested from LPC since I took over school liaison in October 2019.
