

Lacock Parish Council - Highways & Parish Steward Report – JULY 2022

1. CATG Report Progress since April's CATG meeting.

Following an onsite meeting in Lacock with Sarah Dearden WC Highways, Pete Shaw and Stuart Gregory, a revised High Street/ West Street layout was subsequently prepared by Sarah.

The cost of this revised plan is £59,200 and if approved by the Lacock Parish Council it could be funded by £1,000 from the LFIG (was CATG), LPC £20,000 contribution and by making a Substantive Bid to Wiltshire Council for the balance of £38,200.

The revised plan is included with this report for discussion at the LPC on 11th July.

2. Lorry Watch (LW)- Enforcement of 7.5 tonne Weight Restrictions

Now the Jubilee celebrations are completed, the equipment and documents will be issued to the LW volunteers shortly, to start the lorry watch monitoring.

3. Lacock Traffic Group (LTG) Subcommittee reporting to the LPC

Areas of work still under consideration, in addition to those listed in the CATG report section 1, above: -

3.1 Block Drains still to be cleaned by WC Highways

The drainage access into the river needs unblocking from the ditch opposite the raised footway into the river. David Arnup WC has been asked to arrange for this to be done. Still outstanding. Raised now with Derek Walters to progress.

3.2 Auto Speed Watch Camera (ASW) system

WC Highways have been requested to finally approve the installation of our camera.

4. Coaches back in the Village

Coaches have returned to the village and have been observed parking on pavements, on double yellow lines and restricting other drivers access on the roads. To be discussed at the LPC on 11th July.

5. Damage to the grass verge and road side opposite the Abbey entrance

Still awaiting a reply from David Arnup as to when the posts can be fitted by the WC Highways team.

Karen Bolger (NT) has written again requesting when the posts will be installed. The NT have already agreed to landscape the verge by adding more soil and reseeding the area once the posts are installed.

6. Moving the Gate outside the Abbey further towards the Red Lion Entrance

Awaiting reply from Karen Bolger NT to document the issues with the current gateway and what they hope to achieve from moving the gateway. Once NT reply is received, the LTG will discuss the issues with WC Highways and the LHFIG to ask for their ideas with moving the Gateway.

7. Double Yellow Lining still outstanding from 2019

The outstanding short lengths of double yellow lining outside the Abbey and at the top of Nethercote requested in 2019, will now be prioritised by the LHFIG, the replacement for the CATG.

We will be actively requesting the outstanding lining work in Lacock to be completed very soon.


8. Parish Steward (PS)

- Request the WC Road Sweeper tanker return again next month to keep the gutters clear of debris.
