

# Lacock Residents Parking Scheme Information Sheet

Please note that the responses are attempting to address questions for a scheme that is in its infancy and therefore may change as the scheme reaches maturity.

## Q and A

### **? What area of the village will the residents parking Scheme (RPS) cover?**

It is anticipated that the zone will cover the village centre ie. West St, High St, East St and Church St.

### **? Who will be affected by the RPS?**

Anybody who needs to park a vehicle within the zone during the operational parking enforcement times. There are cases where some residents, visitors and others will not need a permit. for example if you park on your driveway or use off street parking.

### **? What are the “operational parking enforcement times”?**

To be decided, but these could typically be 0800-1800 or 24h.

### **? Does having a Parking Permit guarantee a parking space?**

No, but your ability to park near your house is greatly improved particularly during busy periods.

### **? If I have visitors to my home do they need to have a permit?**

Yes. Residents can purchase daily visitor permits each of which are valid for 24hrs. Current costs are 60p per permit. These can be purchased in bulk and used at the residents discretion.

### **? How will the scheme be enforced?**

Wiltshire Council partners with MiPermit to provide monitoring and data for enforcement action.

### **? How much will the scheme cost me?**

Today's rates are £80 per annum for the first vehicle, £100 per annum for the second.

### **? I have a business within the parking zone. Can the scheme accommodate workers who need to use their cars for work.**

Yes, business permits are available at the same cost as visitor permit.

### **? Can i continue to use my car to visit the Post Office?**

Yes, a limited waiting zone will be created outside the post office for non-permit free waiting.

### **? There is a danger of moving the parking problem to areas outside the zone. How will this be managed.?**

It will be necessary to ensure that those areas adjacent to the zone are adequately marked with appropriate parking restrictions. In most cases these will be double yellow lines.

### **? How many permits can I have?**

Most schemes limit the number of permits per residence to two unless off road parking is available in which case the number will be reduced by one. This is to ensure that there is sufficient parking for all
